YES I COULD MAKE FIVE THOUSAND OF THOSE, BUT A FEW FISH AND SOME BREAD MIGHT BE A BETTER OPTION

As evening approached, the disciples came to Him and said, "This is a remote place, and it's already getting late. Send the crowds away, so they can go to the villages and buy themselves some food." Jesus replied, "They do not need to go away. You give them something to eat." – Matthew 14:15-16

So why did Jesus veto the disciple's plan? It was late; Jesus was apparently done teaching; time to send the crowd away. But was Jesus really done teaching? Maybe He just wanted to stop teaching with words, and start teaching with actions.

The feeding of the 5000 had at least three purposes: First, it showed the power of Jesus. Second, it showed the love of Jesus. But third, this "biggest of Jesus' miracles" showed Jesus' deep desire to have and promote connection. "Instead of sending the people home to their individual little bubbles, let's stay together a little longer, and connect a little more, and celebrate the power of connection." Predators like Satan know that the weakest one is often not the sick one, but the isolated one. Through connection we all become stronger.

So why a free community fish fry? For three purposes: First, it shows that our church is alive and strong with the power of Jesus. Second, it shows our church loves with the love of Jesus. Third, it shows that we share Jesus' desire for connection. This fish fry will promote connections, and a stronger community, a stronger church, and stronger people.


Thank You to Ricardo Castillo: We Thanks Ricardo for his constant wok repairing the church electrical system, and his willingness to be called out late at night when necessary.

The Kitty Project

Part A – Renovate the Sunday School Space: Install new carpet, window blinds, lights, and updated child-safe electrical outlets; and paint. Cost = \$29,000

Part B – Renovate the church entranceway: Replace wood paneled walls and tile ceiling with sheetrock; move electrical conduit into the ceiling; install new recessed lighting; and paint. Cost = \$18,000



Part C – Renovate the main building bathrooms: Install new vanities, counters, faucets, and lights; revise the ceiling; and paint. Cost = \$3,000

How Will We Finance This Project?

The total cost of the project is \$50,000. \$20,000 of the needed funds will come from the church budget, and the other \$30,000 will be raised through a capital campaign.

What is the Timeline?

- May and early June: Prayer Campaign and finalize construction details (such as paint color)
- June and July: Raise funds (We don't want to do any construction until after VBS and MAD)
- August and September: Begin construction
- October: Project Dedication


