

2021 Lytle "Citizen of the Year Award" Given to the Lytle United Methodist Church



While this "Citizen of the Year Award" is normally given to an individual, and was therefore given to me as the pastor, all of the ministry that has been done to benefit the city of Lytle over the years has been done not just by me, but by the church as a whole. While the mayor did a good job listing some of this ministry, he missed a lot, so I wanted to take this opportunity to list some of the helping ministries that has made this church "2021 Lytle Citizen of the Year":

- **1.** <u>The Lytle Community Cemetery</u>: When W.C. Newton gave property to the church around 1890 for the formation of a "Community Cemetery," I wonder if he saw it as a blessing or as a burden. It is a blessing to the community, but to us as a church it is a huge and sometimes difficult responsibility. It is a gift we are giving to our community of Lytle, and a third of the Trustees meetings, a third of the hours of our Church Administrator, and many hours of maintenance are spent on the Community Cemetery.
- **2.** <u>The Food Pantry</u>: Perhaps our most visible gift to our community. What you see on the 1st and 3rd Mondays is only a small tip of the iceberg. Below the surface is the raising of the money, providing and maintaining facilities, a huge amount of paperwork, getting and storing the food, bagging the food, etc...
- 3. The Backpack Food Ministry: Another important part of our Community Food Ministry.
- **4.** <u>Project Angel Tree</u>: Over the thirty years of this program, we have given over 6,000 free Christmas gifts to children in need in our community, along with tons of cookies.
- 5. <u>Highway Trash Pickup</u>: Four times a year we pick up trash from a four-mile stretch of a local road.
- **6.** <u>Lytle Area Mission Project</u>: While no longer active, this ministry, started by Diana Jackson, helped repair many homes of people in need throughout the Lytle area.
- 7. Boy Scout, Cub Scout, and Girl Scout Units: all sponsored by our church.
- **8.** <u>Different Support Groups</u>: Including Narcotics Anonymous, Alcohol Anonymous, and an Al-Anon ministry (family members of those with addictions), are all hosted and supported by our church.
- 9. Health Ministries: Our church has hosted a free health clinic, as well as several exercise classes.
- 10. Free Children's Community Programs: VBS, MAD, LOGOS
- 11. <u>Free Meeting Space for Local Non-profits</u>: Including the Lytle school and the Lytle Nursing Home.
- 12. Free Community events: Fish Fry, Pumpkin Party, Pie Festival, etc...

In addition, our church helps people in need with bills, food, housing, etc. And individual members of the congregation are involved in many other volunteer ministries throughout the Lytle area. We truly thank the City of Lytle for honoring our church as the citizen of the year for 2021, but we of course don't do all this to receive honors... we do it simply because we are Christians.
