Scary Summer Stepping-Stones

It was May. I looked to the far shore, September, and then I looked down at the four stones I had to get over to get to the safety of dry ground. Those four slippery stones? A Community Fish Fry, Vacation Bible School, A Church Fund Raising Campaign, and Music, Art and Drama Camp. "We will never get enough volunteers because Covid is still a big fear." "No one will show up." "We won't raise enough money." "I have to make phone calls asking people for help." "People will say no." "I'll make a fool of myself." Aaaacccckkkkk!

So what are your slippery stones? Financial issues or work problems? Health concerns or ministry opportunities? Family?

Something else? We all have stones we are called to cross. Someone once said, "Courage isn't the lack of fear, it's about going despite our fear." I think trust in God is a lot like that. We sing songs in children's Sunday school like, "He'll always guide you and stay right beside you—Trust in the Lord with your H-E-A-R-T," and these songs are absolutely true, but I think "doubt" is part of the human condition in this fallen world. While I appreciate the episode of David facing down Goliath with no doubts, I think I appreciate Moses at the burning bush a lot more. Moses expresses four different doubts…to God Himself. Yet despite his doubts, Moses went, because his trust in God was greater than his doubts.

I think that's the point. Trust is not about having no doubts, or even about growing to the point where we have no doubts—it's about taking the first... and second steps, despite our doubts. Then, when we're past that particular slippery stone, we have the joy of singing, "He did guide me, He did stay right beside me." I knew He would all the time.


Individual Spiritual Goals for 2021
