Two Major Acts of Faithfulness in 2021



1. Catching the Wave Campaign

Waves of people are moving into the Lytle Area
Waves of people are moving into
our mission field
Will the waves simply wash over us?
or will we be faithful and "Catch the Wave?"

Why Is It Important?

Many, if not most of these "new" people either have lost their spiritual connection when they moved, or because of the isolation of Covid, or they never had one. They are God's precious lost sheep, and we are all God's shepherds. Are we going to just sit in the pen, or are we going to get out and help God collect His lost sheep? Jeremiah 23:4 – "I will place shepherds over them who will tend them, and they will no longer be afraid or terrified, nor will any be missing," declares the LORD."

John 21:16 – "Jesus said, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He answered, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Take care of my sheep."

What Is the Plan?

Our Council on Ministries has initiated a four-part ongoing "Catch the Wave" plan:

- 1. Prayer: If you could help with the "Catch the Wave" prayer team, call (830) 772-3345.
- **2.** Church Events: Events like our December "Christmas Caroling," and our upcoming "Free Community Fish-Fry," moved to June 27. Have ideas? Willing to help? Call (830) 772-3345.
- 3. Personal Events: All of us need to learn to get out of our comfort zone and be friendly and inviting.
- **4. Standing Out:** Help make our church and church property stand out, not fade into the background. The Lent/Easter cross in the front yard was a good start. Where do we go from there?



2. The Kitty Project

In April, our church trustees and the finance/administrative council initiated a church renovation project with the title "The Kitty Project," named after our beloved Kitty Alexander.

Part A – Renovate the Sunday School Space: Install new carpet, window blinds, lights, and updated child-safe electrical outlets; and paint. Cost = \$29,000

Kitty was one of our faithful children's Sunday school teachers and she was also highly involved in VBS and other

Christian education programs. Adult and children Christian education were important to her, and they are important to us. It has been a long time since we installed carpet and painted this area of the church. It is time we demonstrated through our hands and our wallets our priorities.

Part B – Renovate the church entranceway: Replace wood paneled walls and tile ceiling with sheetrock; move electrical conduit into the ceiling; install new recessed lighting; and paint. Cost = \$18,000

Kitty loved this church and she loved worship and wanted others to experience her joy. Our church entranceway is a throwback to the 1970s, the decade it was constructed. Unfortunately, an old and tired out looking entranceway yells out "old and tired out church." It's time to replace the 1970 style with a more timeless style, to fit our beautiful and timeless sanctuary.

Part C – Renovate the main building bathrooms: Install new vanities, counters, faucets, and lights; revise the ceiling; and paint. Cost = \$3,000

How Will We Finance This Project?

The total cost of the project is \$50,000. \$20,000 of the needed funds will come from the church budget, and the other \$30,000 will be raised through a capital campaign.

What is the Timeline?

- May and early June: Prayer Campaign and finalize construction details (such as paint color)
- June and July: Raise funds (We don't want to do any construction until after VBS and MAD)

- August and September: Begin construction
- October: Project Dedication


Free VBS 2021, July 5-9
